In the following decades she painted hundreds of landscapes and portraits. She sold a few, but like many artist held on to most of them. Today her paintings adorn the houses of her children.

Jeanette was a survivor of breast cancer. She spent many years giving her time to the Cancer society by counseling others who had to endure the disease.
