On Tuesday, September 12th the world lost a giant as Gregory Slocum suddenly passed but peacefully at home. Greg (or Pepa to his grandchildren) was known for his sharp wit, sense of humor, storytelling, and immense heart. A native of Albany, Greg grew up on South Allen Street as a devoted brother to Drucinda, Brian, Jonathan, Kevin, and Debbie. Greg graduated from the Vincentian Institute Albany in 1976. After graduating Greg embarked on a cross-country journey with his brother Kevin and several of his pals - a trip that would become the origin of many of his most entertaining stories. After returning to Albany, Greg received a degree in Public Administration from Hudson Valley Community College in 1988. Greg began working for the Albany City Water Department in 1991, and one year later married his beloved wife Tracy to whom he was a loving husband for 31 incredible years. Greg retired from the Water Department in 2018, to focus on his life as a devoted dad and cherished grandfather. Greg was an avid reader, a diehard New York Yankees and New York Giants fan, and a lover of all his family pets, he loved to make everyone laugh, but his greatest joy in life was spending time with his wife, children, and grandchildren.
